Stephen N. Lang, M.D.

Steve Lang was born in Kankakee, Illinois on February 14, 1941. He earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Illinois in Champaign and his medical degree at the University of Illinois in Chicago where he was the President of his senior medical school class. Following an internship at Cook County Hospital in Chicago, he came to Duke for an Orthopaedic Residency which he completed in 1971. After a year of private practice with his uncle Morris Lang (Duke Orthopaedic Resident 1942), he returned to Durham to join Dr. Glasson and Dr. Kapoor in a practice which eventually developed into Triangle Orthopaedic Associates.

In 1986 Dr. Lang was recruited to the Duke Orthopaedic Faculty to establish a practice focused on outpatient clinical services. During his twenty-one years as Assistant Professor at Duke he was recognized as a consummate physician. He was honored by his peers at Duke by being the recipient of the Leonard Tow Humanism in Medicine Award in 2005 for compassion and sensitivity in the delivery of health care. Steve retired from Duke in 2007 and joined the Department of Orthopaedics at the University of North Carolina as Associate Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery. At this institution he worked in an "Orthopaedic Prompt Care Clinic" for two years. He rejoined Triangle Orthopaedic

Associates in Durham in 2009 where he continues to practice. He served as President of the Durham-Orange County Medical Society and the North Carolina Orthopaedic Association which presented him with the "Honored Surgeon Award" in 2010. He currently serves as one of the two North Carolina members of the AAOS Board of Councilors. He has held numerous leadership and committee positions in the NCMS, NCOA, and EOA.

As loyal members of the Piedmont Orthopedic Society, Steve and Ginny have attended almost all of the meetings over the past forty years. They are the proud parents of three children, Libby a school teacher at Durham Academy, Jason an orthopaedic surgery faculty member at Wake Forest Medical Center, and Adam a businessman in Shanghai, China.
